SFL – Solid Waste Breakdown

- About 100,000 tons received in 2022

Ohio EPA's Environmental Protection Fund	\$285,000	\$2.85

SFL - Construction and Demolition Debris Breakdown

- About 2 million tons of C&DD Debris waste received in 2022.
- Funds flow through the Seneca County General Health District and then are remitted to various agencies.

Break down of Health Dept. C&DD Program funds

Agency or Department	Fees Generated	Cost Per Ton
Loudon Township	\$160,000.000	\$0.08
Seneca County	\$120,000.000	\$0.06
Division of Materials and Waste Management's C&DD Program	\$120,000.000	\$0.06
Seneca Co. General Health District	\$800,000.000	\$0.40

Breakdown

- In 2022, the landfill paid \$3.675 million in fees
- Of that funding, \$800,000 (21.7 percent) goes directly to the Seneca County General Health District to be used for oversight functions.
- Seneca County receives \$120,000 (3.26%)
- Loudon Township receives \$160,000 (4.35%)
- These three combined make up 29.4% of all funding generated via Solid Waste and C&DD Disposal Fees.
- This doesn't take into account fees collected by the Solid Waste Management District
