

Proclamation

WHEREAS, Alice Marie Miller, of Green Springs, served as a nurse in the United States Navy during World War II, and

WHEREAS, Miller, who is set to turn 101 years old on January 20th, deserves the honor and recognition of the community for her service to our community and to our nation, and

WHEREAS, as we approach Miller's birthday, the Seneca County Board of Commissioners wishes to bring attention and recognition to her efforts during the war. Miller served at the U.S. Naval Hospital in Bremerton, Washington, among several other hospitals across the country. Miller also spent time aboard the hospital ship, the USS Solace. She began her service in January of 1943, and served for four years, six months and 21 days, and

WHEREAS, Miller comes from an era when women were not often recognized for their contributions to the military. We hope this proclamation serves as a clear and powerful reminder of our community's great appreciation for the military veterans and active-duty military members who have fought and continue to fight for our freedom, and

WHEREAS, we as Seneca County citizens and as Americans are forever indebted to heroes like Alice Miller, and we have the utmost appreciation for her unselfish actions and sacrifices during a tumultuous time in our nation's history, and

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that this Board of Commissioners, Seneca County, Ohio, recognizes the distinguished military service and career of Alice Marie Miller as a nurse during World War II.
